PILOT MENTAL HEALTH CAMPAIGN - LORRI FONTENOT, a registered nurse, and BRANDON MIGUEZ, an airline pilot, were part of a delegation that recently spoke to the House of Representatives and were instrumental in the House unanimously passing of the MENTAL HEALTH IN AVIATION ACT OF 2025. Lorri and Brandon are both former members of our congregation who moved out of state. They are the daughter and grandson of Beverly Weselak and also related to the Fatta, Bourgeois and Dotts clan. This bill requires the FAA to overhaul its mental health policies and culture. Previously, if a pilot sought mental health treatment, they were suspended for 6 months without pay with no guarantee that they would be reinstated. Seeking help is not a weakness, but a strength. This bill is now moving on to the Senate for their approval.

A reredos is actually an ornamental screen covering the wall at the back of an altar. We do not have a formal altar, so we use the term for the shelf.


