REV. DWIGHT BAILEY



In my sermon this past Sunday I told the story of a pastor I met last week. His name is Rev. Dwight Bailey, and he is a retired pastor living in Shreveport, and a member of Kings Highway

Christian Church. As I said in my sermon, several months ago while attending a meeting in Mississippi, Rev. Bailey had a bad fall and suffered a "C6 incomplete spinal fracture." That injury is as bad as it sounds: presently Rev. Bailey is paralyzed from the neck down.

As word spread about what happened, many of our churches in the Great River Region, as well as across the nation, have offered prayers for Rev. Bailey. I invite our church to do the same. When I met Rev. Bailey, I was struck by his deep spirituality and patience. Despite the economic and personal struggles this injury is causing, Rev. Bailey was at peace with God and I could see the support of his brothers and sisters daily lifted his spirits.

When I entered his room, I noticed that the walls of his room were covered with cards and pictures sent by individuals and children and families to let him know they were praying for him. I invite you to send a card as well:

There is some good news to share as well. When Rev. Bailey was first injured, he had no movement at all in any of his limbs. Now, through intensive rehab, he has regained a little motion in both his arms and legs. Hopefully this is a sign that his body will renew and reconnect the nerves that were damaged!

Our Regional Minister, Rev. Nadine Burton, also invites us to send donations to help offset some of the medical expenses. Rev. Bailey will need a custom wheelchair that he can control with whatever limited movement he has, and that wheelchair will cost around \$20,000. Beyond that are so many other out of pocket expenses. For this reason, Rev. Burton has started a Go-Fund-Me campaign: <u>https://www. gofundme.com/f/rev-dwight-bailey</u> So far a little over \$16,000 of the \$50,000 goal has been raised. If you are able to give, please know your generosity will be appreciated.

In my sermon, I mentioned how transformative my meeting with Rev. Bailey was. I was part of a group of ministers who went to minister to him. What we found was that he ministered to us! His words of encouragement were truly from the heart. Whatever pity party I might be throwing for myself, I felt I had to give up. If Rev. Bailey can find God's faithfulness in his situation, certainly I will find God in mine.
