THIS DAY IN HISTORY



Recently I was exploring a "This Day in History" website looking for a little inspiration. It was August 10, and I discovered that on that day, in 1846, the US Congress chartered the Smithsonian Institution.

The story behind the Smithsonian Institution is an odd and interesting one. It is named after James Smithson, an English chemist who lived in Britain and Europe all his life, and who never visited the United States. He had some mis-adventures during the French Revolution, being imprisoned and later released, and he had some success as a chemist

helping develop an important chemical process for making brass. Smithson never married and had no children, so when he passed away in 1829 he willed his estate to a nephew with the stipulation that if the nephew died without any heirs, the remaining estate should be forwarded "to the United States of America, to found at Washington, under the name of the Smithsonian Institution, an Establishment for the increase & diffusion of knowledge among men." Unfortunately the nephew passed away about six years later, unmarried and without any heirs, and the remaining \$500,000 estate was sent to the US.

I don't think James Smithson had any idea of what would happen with the seed he planted in a land he never visited, establishing an institution for which no one was asking. I don't think he, or the US Congress of 1846, envisioned the Institution growing such that today it encompasses 19 museums, 21 libraries, nine research centers, and zoo with additional affiliate facilities located in 45 states, Puerto Rico and Panama. I don't think anyone envisioned that Kori, my wife, would be employed at a massive Smithsonian museum celebrating the successes of human flight from Kitty Hawk to the Moon and beyond. That small seed Smithson planted grew into a massive and admirable tree!

It makes me think of a line from one of Wendell Berry's poems:

Plant sequoias.
Say that your main crop is the forest that you did not plant, that you will not live to harvest.

We often get caught up in what we can do to reap a harvest here and now, but we may never know the much-more-dramatic-effect that the seeds we plant today will have for tomorrow.

In my sermon this past Sunday, I mentioned the prophet Elijah's total frustration when he realized all of his extraordinary prophetic endeavors hadn't changed a single heart. What I failed to mention is that a little over three thousand years later we still remember and celebrate Elijah, and look to him as an example of faith. Though Elijah's work foundered in his own time, future generations would find incredible value and insight in him.

The long-term potential of the seeds we plant is true of the positive investment we make in others, and it is true of the negative seeds of anger and violence and mistrust that we may plant as well. We may never see the long range effects of our actions today, for better or for worse — let us be alert and sow seeds of faith and love trusting that God will bring a blessed increase.
