Sunday, November 7 - Rev. Dr. Michael Elmore

Sunday, November 14 - Rev. Laura Phillips-Peters was formerly an Associate Pastor at FCCBRLA, and went to Overland Park Christian Church in March 2013 as the Associate Pastor. In August of 2017 OPCC called Laura to serve as the Senior Pastor, the first woman to do so in OPCC's history. While at FCCBRLA, Laura was actively involved in leading and developing youth congregational growth, but in guiding a group of girls at Runnels school. No matter the ministry of the church, Laura seeks to create a safe and inviting place for all who are seeking, questioning, doubting, and looking for a relationship with God, no matter where they are on their journey. Ordained in 2009, Laura attended Lexington Theological Seminary and the University of Missouri. Her background and faith journey has colored her commitment to peace, social justice, outreach, and the many different ways in which people can experience God uniquely and authentically.

Sunday, November 21 - The Rev. Dedrick "DJ" Minor — known to his friends and family as simply "DJ" — is someone that many of you may recognize. He has worked as a clinical chaplain in various healthcare settings for nearly 20 years and is currently a chaplain at Our Lady of the Lake. Dedrick received a Bachelors from Oral Roberts University in New Testament Theology and Business Administration, a Masters of Divinity from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, and will receive a Doctor of Ministry (with the specialization in Pastoral Counseling) this December from New

Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. He was ordained by the Disciples of Christ in 2011 during his three-year tenure as associate pastor at Olive Branch Ministries of GNO Kenner. As a preacher's kid, Dedrick grew up in the church and started preaching at the age of 15. He also shared that he enjoys good coffee, jazz (even named his dog after Miles Davis), reading, writing, cooking, and basketball (life long Duke Blue Devil fan).

Sunday, November 28 - Rev. Cheryl Russell, who accepted her call to ministry while living in Baton Rouge and active at First Christian Church. She shares: I grew up in Central Indiana and found my way to Baton Rouge, Louisiana in 2007. I taught middle school outside Baton Rouge for three years and during that time I was an active member of First Christian Church, Baton Rouge. Daylight Saving Time Ends November 7 - Fall Back One Hour



Benjamin Franklin takes the honor (or the blame, depending on your view of the time changes) for coming up with the idea to reset clocks in the summer months as a way to conserve energy, according to David Prerau, author of "Seize"

the Daylight: The Curious and Contentious Story of Daylight Saving Time" (Thunder's Mouth Press, 2005). By moving clocks forward, people could take advantage of the extra evening daylight rather than wasting energy on lighting. At the time, Franklin was ambassador to Paris and so wrote a witty letter to the Journal of Paris in 1784, rejoicing over his "discovery" that the sun provides light as soon as it rises.

Even so, DST didn't officially begin until more than a century later. Germany established DST in May 1916 as a way to conserve fuel during World War I. The rest of Europe came onboard shortly thereafter. And in 1918, the United States adopted daylight saving time.
