Search and Call Committee Update by Carol Madere

As the chair of the Search and Call Committee, I am pleased to announce that the committee has voted to recommend Rev. Dr. Dedrick Minor to be our permanent senior minister.

This decision was made after an eight-month process which included preparing a congregational profile, surveying the congregation about its preferences for our next minister, and reviewing the ministerial profiles provided to us by the Region. After reviewing over 25 profiles, we concluded that there were only about five candidates who merited further consideration. The other candidates were rejected for the one of the following reasons: (1) the candidate expressed a preference for staying in the region where s/he currently resided; (2) the candidate was looking for a congregation with characteristics which ours doesn't possess; (3) the candidate preferred a larger church than we have; or, (4) our congregation couldn't fulfill the candidate's salary expectations.

Of the five candidates we decided to consider further, Pastor Minor seemed to best fit the characteristics our church had identified as important in the congregational survey. Those qualities included being an effective preacher/speaker; helping people develop their own spiritual life; effectively ministering to people in crisis; making pastoral calls on members unable to come to church; and, being accepting of people with different backgrounds and traditions. We were advised by the regional minister to pursue only one candidate at a time, so we decided to interview him first.

The committee met with Pastor Minor and interviewed him regarding his vision for the church and how he felt he could best serve the church. We also discussed with him the constraints of being a bi-vocational minister, serving our congregation while continuing his work at Our Lady of the Lake Hospital, and he assured us that he will always be available when the church needs him. At the end of the meeting, he was excused, and the committee voted unanimously to call him as our next senior minister. I presented our recommendation to the General Board on March 15. The Board voted unanimously to accept our recommendation to call Pastor Minor.

As many of you are aware, the Search and Call process has multiple steps before a new senior minister can be officially hired. The next step involves the Search and Call Committee negotiating terms of a job offer with the candidate in conjunction with review and recommendations of the Finance and Pastoral Relations committees. Those terms will be shared with the congregation once agreed upon and prior to the congregational meeting. The last steps involve the church hosting a "meet the candidate" fellowship event and then having a congregational meeting to vote on said candidate.

On Saturday, April 30, we will host a fellowship meal to be followed by Pastor Minor speaking to share his vision of the future for the church and tell us more about what he feels God is calling him to do here. After that, we will open the floor for members who might have questions for the candidate.

Normally, this would be a time for the congregation to meet a prospective candidate for the first time. In our unique situation, we have had a chance to get to know Pastor Minor already. However, we take this whole process very seriously and we recognize that not everyone may have been thinking along the same lines and considering him for senior minister before now, or perhaps you haven't had a chance to speak with him before now, or maybe you just have some questions you'd like to hear any candidate's take on. We encourage you to turn out and take advantage of this opportunity to ask your questions, so that you can make the most informed decision possible when we vote the next day.

Board Chair Pam Jones has called a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, May 1, immediately following the 10:00 a.m. service to vote on candidate Dedrick Minor for the position of Senior Minister of First Christian Church of Baton Rouge (DOC).

I'd like to thank each member of the Search and Call Committee, who have met diligently for eight months to discern God's will for the leadership of our congregation. They include Vicki Krupula, Lucy Cody, Carmen Jones, Ed Atkins, Frank Dickinson, Mike Wilson, and Dak McInnis.

We ask that each of you continue to keep the Search and Call Committee, as well as Pastor Minor, in your prayers as we all take the next steps in this process together. God Bless.

As we begin a new church service year, and as we can resume core activities that were put on pandemic hold, we are seeking ways that we might serve God's kingdom in 2022. At the Board meeting held on March 15, it was announced that Judy Lester will lead our Outreach Committee this year. After consulting with Reverend Minor and lay leadership, a decision was made that we would ease into this initiative by focusing our efforts in areas where we already have strong connections. The areas preliminarily identified were: Southeast Ministries, Istrouma Middle School (Aaron Turnipseed's school), and CASA.

ISTROUMA MIDDLE SCHOOL: There are two service opportunities ready for us:

- 1. **5K Run sponsorship** (April 23, 2022) Istrouma allocates very little money for its music department (\$3-500 annually for all classes). Aaron is again asking for financial sponsorship of his 5K run to help augment the program. FCCBR has benefited greatly from the participation of these young musicians in our cantatas and other worship services. We hope to continue our relationship with them and be a positive influence in their lives, as they are in ours.
- 2. Venue and hosting an "end-of-year" choral program (May 18, 2022) FCCBR will host an Istrouma student choral performance, tentatively scheduled Wednesday, May 18, at 7:00 p.m. We plan to provide a reception in the fellowship hall after the performance for the students and their families. We will need volunteers to help decorate, set up, clean up, prepare food, and serve. Sign-up sheets will be posted soon, as the plans are confirmed. We hope that our entire congregation will attend to support Aaron and his students!

SOUTHEAST MINISTRIES: We are a supporting church of the Southeast Ministries Food Bank. All donations are welcomed and appreciated, but the Outreach Committee would like to also highlight a specific item or category each month for your consideration.

Since everybody deserves a treat occasionally, we'd like to designate sweets for the month of April. This can include items such as cake mixes, brownie mixes, pudding mixes, cookie mixes, etc. Please bring your donations to the church and place in the narthex. Trimming Down the Tech Troubles

As many of you are aware, we have been plagued by tech issues for some time now on multiple fronts — sound, video, Internet, livestream — and God bless our dedicated volunteers who have labored to deal with each issue as it arose, find workarounds, and just generally keep us functioning. As Pastor Minor shared a couple of weeks ago, we engaged the services of an outside consultant to come in and assess our systems and software to troubleshoot the issues we've been experiencing. Based on the recommendations we received, we have purchased a new computer for the sanctuary to run the worship program, switched to a new software called Easy Worship to build our weekly program, and installed two Pan-Tilt-Zoom cameras at the rear of the sanctuary. We aren't done yet, and sound is the next big item to address, but we hope you are already seeing the difference in the appearance of our service online beginning with the March 13 service and going forward.

Many thanks to our volunteers who work to build the program, run the sound board, run the video program, and operate the livestream each week. The new equipment is great and we feel that investing in this gear was a worthwhile purchase, but without our wonderful members who give of their time regularly, it's just gear that would be sitting there benefitting no one. Please join me in thanking the following individuals who regularly contribute to our service on the tech front: Anderson Krupala, Callie Cody, Carol Madere, Frank Dickinson, Greg Taliaferro, Jeff Cody, Jill Brian, Nico Morgan, Sue Grigg, and Ted Baldwin.
