Advent Season Project

"The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the

least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for Me'..."

Matthew 25:40



Our Advent service project this year will be in support of a Ukrainian outreach ministry that Reverend Mark Garner, an interim pastor within our own Great River Region, has been involved with. Mark is supporting a Ukrainian family who, in addition to caring for their own four children, have taken on the huge task of caring for 40-50 conflict-impacted teenagers. Many of these kids, who have already suffered tragic conditions and incredible stress, are now trapped in a

"Catch-22"... having aged-out of Ukraine's orphanage system's capabilities, but being too young to receive state support. Funds raised by this ministry thus far have been used to provide housing and simple job training for these youth. Mark has suggested that our donations will be used to provide winter coats and boots. However, in an attempt at making a personal connection that will show our concern and prayers for peace and support, we ask that each FCCBRLA family bring two pair of warm colorful boot socks (one women's size and one men's size - no packaged socks, please) rolled (not wrapped) and tied up with Christmas ribbon, each affixed with a Christmas Card with a personal note from your family. These cards and socks, along with some hard candy, will be mailed directly to the

kids in the hope of providing a little Christmas cheer. The dates for this project are from November 5th through December 10th. Mark will be preaching on Sunday, November 12th and attending our Thanksgiving Fellowship Luncheon afterwards. I hope everyone will come out to hear his story and share in our fellowship that day.



Upcoming Bylaws Changes

The Governance Committee met this summer to review the church's bylaws. They suggested the following changes, which were approved by the Board at its September member. Text in red was added. Text in blue was changed from its original wording. Congregation members will be asked to ratify these bylaws changes at the annual congregational meeting on Dec. 3.

- 1. Board Members must be willing to sign and abide by a written "Service Commitment" stipulating meeting attendance requirements and avoidance of conflicts of interest. (to be deleted)
- 2. BOARD MEMBERS--The committee wants to add the Diaconate Chair to the board.

The Board shall consist of eleven members:

- 1. Board Chair
- 2. Board Chair-elect
- 3. Treasurer
- 4. Secretary
- 5. Elder chair (ex-officio with full voting privileges)
- 6. Diaconate chair (ex-officio with full voting privileges)
- 7. Six Members at-large

3. Length of Term

The Board Chair, Board Chair-elect, Treasurer, Secretary and Elder chair shall serve one year terms with the option of a second year in the same position. The Board Chair Elect must serve one year before serving one year as Board Chair.

Members at-large shall serve two year terms, with three members elected each year, and the other three continuing. Members at large are limited to two consecutive terms. Elders shall elect a chair at an organizational meeting to be held before the first Board meeting of each year. No Elder shall hold the position of Elder Chair in excess of two consecutive years without a sabbatical year. However, a chair may change positions without a sabbatical year. The Elder Chair shall be an ex-officio member of the nominating committee.

A Deacon's service term shall be for three consecutive years, followed by at least one year of sabbatical. However, a deacon may change positions without a sabbatical year. Candidates for the Diaconate will be selected by the Nominating Committee as part of the slate of candidates presented for election at the annual congregational business meeting. The Diaconate shall elect a chair at an organizational meeting to be held before the first Board meeting of each year. No one shall hold the position of Deacon Chair in excess of two consecutive years. The Deacon Chair shall be an ex-officio member of the nominating committee.

Deacons shall elect a chair at an organizational meeting to be held before the first Board meeting of each year. No Deacon shall hold the position of Deacon Chair in excess of two consecutive years without a sabbatical year. However, a chair may change positions without a sabbatical year. The Diaconate Chair shall be an ex-officio member of the Church Board and the Nominating Committee with full voting privileges. A Sacraments Committee Member's service term shall be for three consecutive years. A Sacraments Committee Member may change positions without a sabbatical year.

Board Meetings

Meetings of the Board shall be held at least once every third of the year at a time and place to be determined by the Board Chair. Board meetings shall be held to address the business of the Congregation. All Board meetings are open-door attendance to any member of the Congregation unless, under exceptional circumstances, the Board Chair, Board Chair-elect or a majority of the Board calls for a closed-door session. Chairs of all standing Ministry Committees, such as Worship, Fellowship, Church Growth, Finance, Personnel, and Outreach shall be required to attend Board meetings and present written reports to the Board.

Quorum

The quorum required to transact business shall be a majority of the board members. If a quorum is not present, board members may receive and accept reports, but may not vote on issues of personnel or those which may be financially binding on the congregation.

C. Terms of service

The term of service for any elected or appointed position shall begin on January 15 of each year.
